A TIMELINE TO PLAN FOR

The newest revision of IATF 16949 (formerly ISO/TS 16949) states:

- Organizations seeking initial certification can choose to be certified to ISO/TS 16949:2009 until Oct. 1, 2017
- ISO/TS 16949:2009 certification is valid through Sept. 14, 2018; then recertification to IATF 16949 will be required
- Beginning Oct. 1, 2017, new certifications and recertifications must be to IATF 16949

That means companies should have a plan in place now. The question is – do you have a plan or know how to formulate one?

IATF 16949/ISO 9001:2015 ORGANIZATIONAL TRANSITION (ONE-ON-ONE)

Let The Center's experienced quality leaders guide your company through the IATF 16949 changes and assist with your QMS transition one-on-one, including four sessions at your facility. Typical timing is two weeks between sessions to provide time for assigned homework. Careful tracking is part of the package to ensure timely completion of all requirements.

IATF 16949/ISO 9001:2015 TRANSITION USER GROUP (IN-PERSON GROUP)

The Center's Transition User Group program leads your transition team in developing and implementing the requirements and application of the IATF 16949/ISO 9001:2015 requirements manual. The program includes four face-to-face sessions at The Center, with two weeks between sessions for participants to work through class instruction, case studies, and company-specific coursework assignments. This program does not include internal auditor training.
